

did, while being a public or party official, commit a theft offense, as defined in division (K) of section 2913.01 of the Revised Code, when the property or service involved is owned by this state, any other state, the United States, a county, a municipal corporation, a township, or any political subdivision, department, or agency of any of them, or is owned by a political party, or is part of a political campaign fund and the value of property or services stolen was five thousand dollars or more.




